SNUG SUM IN TREASURY. LADIES OF CEMETERY ASSOCIATION MAKE REPORTS ON SUMMER'S WORK. STATEMENT SHOWS A BALANCE OF MORE THAN TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS IN TREASURY.

The ladies of the Cemetery Association have issued their report covering the period from March 1 to December 1, 1906. The report shows a gratifying state of affairs and a cash balance of more than \$200 is on hand for commencing operations again next spring.

Total receipts	577.01
Total disbursements	357.84
Balance cash on hand	\$219.17

It will be seen from the above statement as prepared by Mrs. F. C. Field, that the ladies have raised a considerable sum of money, and this was accomplished only by hard work. Only the ladies themselves know and appreciate the great amount of labor that must be performed to accomplish such results as they have accomplished during the season just closed. That the public appreciates the efforts being put forth by these intelligent and public spirited women goes without saying and they will have the assistance and hearty sympathy of the community in all future efforts. Their work has been most effective and the cemetery is now a beautiful, well kept spot. Through the efforts of the Ladies Auxiliary to the cemetery association, Wadena now boasts of one of the most beautiful cemeteries of any town in the state.

We are informed that of the cash balance left over in the treasury, \$200 has been placed out at interest and there are some moneys due which will come in soon which will bring the total of receipts up nearly \$25 higher. There is due from rummage sales the sum of \$3.20 and for graves dug and not paid for the sum of \$15.00.
